

Orange Class Half Termly Newsletter Autumn 1



English: In English we will be reading Oliver Twist. Our focus will be on re-writing the story, then writing a version in a modern setting. We will also be writing a non-chronological report about Victorian Oldham and working on some poems based on Victorian times.

<u>Maths:</u> In Maths we will focus on place value including counting in hundreds and three digit numbers. We will also be looking at addition and subtraction. Science: In Science we will be learning about forces and magnets. We will learning about friction and how forces work in pairs. We will be examining magnetic attraction and how magnets work through tests and investigations.

<u>**History</u>**: We will be learning about how the Victorians had an impact on Oldham with a focus on Royton in particular. We will explore this by looking at education, inventions and work during the Victorian times, as well as transport.</u> **Topic:** How did the Victorian period change Oldham and what does this mean for me?



Design and Technology:

We will be designing and making money wallets, in keeping with our Oliver theme. The pupils will learn to sew.

<u>RE:</u> The children will be learning about the importance of rules in religion. We will focus mainly on Christianity and especially the Ten Commandments. We will then look at rules in non-Christian faiths.

<u>PSHE</u>: The children will be learning about relationships and how we can be good friends.

Computing:

The children will be learning about online safety, what is great about the internet and graphing.

<u>Music</u>: The children will be learning with the music service, focusing on playing the violin. We are practising for our summer performance at the Bridgewater Hall - fingers crossed!

<u>PE:</u> The children will be developing their coordination, balancing and footwork in PE this half term. It will be outside when the weather allows.

Homework: Homework will be set every **<u>Friday</u>** on Google Classroom and must be completed by the following **<u>Wednesday</u>**. Further information about reading books will be sent out in the coming weeks. In the meantime please ensure you listen to your child read every day at home. Your child is asked to learn the spellings for each week for a test every Friday. The spellings for every week are on the reverse of this newsletter. Practise the following times tables for weekly testing: x3 and x4.
