### Attendance

**The whole school attendance for WE 13/02/15 was 98.17% which was slightly lower than last week, this week's attendance was above our target of 96.5%.**

### Asthma

Does your child suffer from asthma? If your child has asthma we need to ensure that a health plan is in place in school and that there is an inhaler on the premises for use.

The health plan gives vital information that could be beneficial to inform a medical professional of in the case of an emergency.

From 1st October 2014 the Human Medicines (Amendment) (No. 2) Regulations 2014 will allow schools to keep a salbutamol inhaler for use in emergencies. We now have emergency inhalers in school **BUT** the emergency salbutamol inhaler can only be used by children, for whom written parental consent for use of the emergency inhaler has been given, who have either been diagnosed with asthma and prescribed

an inhaler, or have been prescribed an inhaler as reliever medication. This is why it is so important that we have the correct details for your child and a completed Health care plan in place.

**No matter how infrequently your child needs their inhaler we do need to have an inhaler in school for them to use in an emergency.**



### OUR GOLDEN PROMISES

Our Golden Promise badge is part of our school uniform and links in with our Golden Promise system which is a Promise that each of us makes promising to always work hard and behave well. Our Golden Promises are:

- 1) promise to be honest at all times.
- 2) promise to always do my best.
- 3) promise to show respect to myself and others.
- 4) promise to keep myself and others safe.
- 5) promise to look after my property and that of others.



Children should all have a Golden Promises badge which they are required to wear at all times as it shows that they commit to these promises. Children can lose their badge if they consistently break any promises. There is a system displayed in classrooms that children are aware of and there are clear steps that show how well they have been keeping their promises. If a badge is lost, children can earn it back by modifying their behaviour. Children who consistently behave well will receive rewards each week through Golden Time. This is timetabled each week for 30 minutes where enrichment activities are planned in class. The children will plan this with their classteacher and this could include activities such as a visitor coming in or writing and performing a play.

Miss placed badges can be replaced at a cost of £1 from the school office.
