As you know, we take every opportunity to make sure our children keep safe on the internet. We would like to make you aware of the NSPCC's guide to apps and games your children might be using.

They grade each one for signing up, reporting issues, privacy settings and safety advice. It also includes the minimum age requirement. There are many apps that primary children should not have access to. Whilst the internet is very useful it can pose dangerous risks to our children.

Games such as Call of Duty and Grand Theft Auto are not appropriate for primary children. They contain highly inappropriate material for those under the age of 18.

Thank you to everyone that donated to this campaign and responded so quickly.



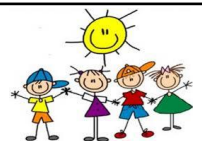
TOAN Event Permission

CATCH IT ,BIN IT, KILL IT!!!!



With the number of people suffering from colds and coughs etc. being reported at the moment, it is more important than ever that we help ourselves and each other by practicing good hand hygiene.

One of the most effective ways of protecting everyone is by remember the simple phrase:

CATCH IT - Always carry tissues and use them to cover your nose and mouth when you cough or sneeze.

BIN IT - Dispose of used tissues as soon as possible.

KILL IT – Clean your hands with soap and water as soon as you can and make sure you wash them frequently. If you have no washing facilities, make use of an alcohol gel.

Studies have shown that respiratory infections are reduced in groups of people who practice good hand and respiratory hygiene measures.

Cold and flu germs can live on your hands and in tissues for hours for hours, meaning they can be easily transmitted. Just a few simple steps can help prevent the viruses from spreading.

The advice is also likely to have a positive effect on other germs and viruses which can lead to diarrhoea and vomiting.



Make sure you do everything you can to prevent yourself and your family having a miserable time being ill by practicing good hand hygiene .
