

Attendance

Exciting Building News

We have been successful in obtaining a grant from Manchester Diocese to improve our main entrance. As you know, the steps at the main entrance can be difficult to access so we are creating a new entrance on Ormerod Avenue. We are creating a new door and a ramp will be added for easier access. This will be kept secure with extra fencing and will be linked to our entrance system.

We intend this entrance to be for staff and children to avoid any congestion at the current one. We will still greet visitors at the current main entrance, as is the system now. If you do need access via the ramp you will, of course be able use this new entrance.

The work will be carried out during term time and all the necessary health and safety arrangements have been made with our contractors. The work should be completed after half term and it will keep our children even safer.

Term time absences

A pupil's absence during term time can seriously disrupt their continuity of learning. Not only do they miss the teaching provided on the days they are away, they are also less prepared for subsequent lessons on their return. There is a consequent risk of underachievement.

Parents/carers do not have a right to take their child out of school during term time. As a result family holidays should be planned during the school holidays. Since September 2013 our Governors have agreed that, in line with new law, no leave taken in term time would be authorised unless for a medical reason for the individual child (i.e. an operation) where medical evidence can be provided.

In accordance with the Local Authority Attendance Policy, school will class any absences that meet the criteria as unauthorised absences and will refer for a Fixed Penalty Notice fine.



World Thinking Day

On **Monday 22nd February** it is World Thinking Day. This is a day of friendship, advocacy and fundraising for 10 million Girlguides and Girl Scouts around the world. On the day members of all uniformed organisations (Rainbows, Brownies, Guides, Beavers, Scouts etc) can wear their uniform to school instead of their usual school one. First Aid training

This week we have had St John's Ambulance on site delivering first aid training to our children. Y6 received First Aid in a Day training, Y5/6 core skills first aid, Y4/5 bleeding and bandaging, Y3/4 and Y2 first aid taster and Yr3 had a first aid taster. We also had a parents' session on essential first aid and this was very well attended.

From the feedback we have received from the children these were fun and informative sessions which have taught them essential skills. We also received very positive feedback from the trainers on the behaviour of all our children. We are in safe hands!



Please drive and park safely and considerately around our school to keep children safer.



We have had recent reports of near misses surrounding our school in relation to people parking on the pavement. Please do not wait until a child is seriously hurt (or worse) before action is taken!!!!

The police are now involved and are quite horrified at the level of illegal parking surrounding our school which puts our children's safety at risk. There will be a regular police presence and road traffic fines will be issued in future for illegal and dangerous driving.

Where can you park?

You should park your vehicle in line with the parking restrictions in place, at all times. When arriving by vehicle at school, please leave sufficient time to park safely and legally.

You must not park on school 'keep clear' or zig zag markings (Ormerod Avenue).



Parking on pavements

The highway code states : You **MUST NOT** park partially or wholly on the pavement unless signs permit it. Parking on the pavement can obstruct and seriously inconvenience pedestrians, people in wheelchairs or with visual impairments and people with prams or pushchairs.

Double parking

You cannot double park, even if you stay in your car. Vehicles parked in the middle of the road cause obstructions for all road users and may block the view for pedestrians, especially children wishing to cross the road.

Child safety tips

If your child is walking please remind them to:

- First find a safe place to cross the road
- Stop near the kerb
- Look all around for traffic and listen
- If traffic is coming let it pass
- When it's safe they should walk straight across the road – and not run, looking and listening while they cross.
- If there are parked cars then they should try their best not to cross between them but if there is nowhere else to cross:
- Choose a place where there is a space between two cars
- Make sure neither car is about to move off
- Walk to the outside edge of the cars and stop
- Then use the green cross code to cross the road.
- You must also ensure that your child is using the correct child seat for their size.
