Purchase of high quality PE resources which link specifically to the scheme. Purchase of quality equipment to enhance provision at playtimes in KS1 and KS2	£900	Access for all year groups	Resources continued to be replenished. Children have access to high quality equipment in PE and develop skills well. Outdoor provision and quality outdoor equipment has also been purchased. This has positively impacted on playtime behaviour and will form further work on developing team skills and resilience further.
Oldham Schools Competition Coordinator	£540	Access for all year groups	Children participated in events across the borough in a range of sports. The impact of this was that children who do not usually participate in competitive sport were chosen to join in. This also impacted on the children with other commitments after school as they could join in during school hours.
Professional Development for key members of staff	£200	PE Leader Class teachers	Staff continued to develop their skills in teaching PE through observing expert coaches and bought-in support.
Oldham Sports Development to support the delivery of high quality PE all year round.	£3688	Y3-Y6 rotated termly	Children improved skills in the taught areas of the PE curriculum. Staff increased their knowledge of high quality skills in PE.
Provision of Zumba as an extracurricular activity.	£600	Access to all year groups	A wider range of opportunities continued to be provided to promote a

			healthy lifestyle. This impacted positively on the KS1 children and widened their opportunities to join in.
Transport to interschool sports events	£500	Access to all year groups	Children had the opportunity to participate in interschool events. All children remained included.
Oldham Sports Development Sports Day	£350	Access to all year groups	All children accessed a well organised sports day at which parents can attend and support. This raised the profile of sport and encouraged all children to participate.
