This week in English, we have started working on explanation texts. We have focused on time adverbials and using conjunctions for cause and effect. The children have found this quite a challenge. We have written explanation texts for how the ear works.

In maths, we have continued looking at subtraction. This week we have solved problems and looked at how to use number lines to help us with our calculations.

Homework:

Maths: Addition and subtraction word problems (show your working out!)

Topic Homework: Find out five facts about the Roman Empire and think of three things you would like to find out (record these as questions)

Talk Homework: It's not fair!

To see that an overreaction does not bring about peaceful solution.

Talk: Think about all the countries in the world where people are struggling to get on. Do you ever struggle to get on with anyone? How can you solve this?

Maths Homework Y3:

1. A shop has 765 magazines. 46 are sold in the morning and 289 are sold in the afternoon. How many magazines are left?
2. Two schools visited the library on Friday. One school took out 189 books. The second school took out 235 books. How many books were taken out in total? There are 985 books left, how many books were in the library on Thursday?
3. Miss Smith's class are collecting conkers. So far they have collected 285. If a local park donates another 129, how many more do they need to reach their target of 500?
4. Last year, the school PTA raised £147 for school. This year they raised £308 more, if a local business offered to double this year's money, how much will they have raised in total

Maths Homework Y4:

1. A shop has 3765 magazines. 146 are sold in the morning and 1289 are sold in the afternoon. How many magazines are left?
2. Two schools visited the library on Friday. One school took out 1089 books. The second school took out 1235 books. How many books were taken out in total? There are 3985 books left, how many books were in the library on Thursday?
