This week we have been learning:

- We have been revising the phonemes: oi as in boil, oy as in toy, ear as in beard, ue as in blue, ew as in chew and u-e as in flute. The children have been reading a variety of words containing these phonemes.

This week's homework is to match the clocks for o'clock and half past times. Spellings for this week will focus on the phoneme **ph** as in **graph**.
