This week we have been learning:

This week in English, we have started working on a story called The Adventures of Robin Hood. We have focused on writing dialogue and using inverted commas. We have also looked at writing a prologue for the book to set the scene. In maths, Year 3 have looked at time and have focused on year, months, weeks, days, hours and minutes. Year 4 have worked on hundredths and we have related this to decimals. We have been dividing one and 2 digit numbers by 100 to find decimals.

Maths: Y3- Time

Y4- Dividing 1 and 2 digit numbers by 100

English: Inverted commas

Knowledge Organiser: Magna Carta Libertatum is Medieval Latin for "the Great Charter of the Liberties", commonly called the **Magna Carta** (also **Magna Charta**; "Great Charter"), is a charter of rights agreed to by King John of England in 1215. It set out the first laws and everyone, including the monarch, must obey the law of the land.

Spelling: The /ɪ/ sound spelt y elsewhere than at the end of words e.g. *Egypt, pyramid*

Talk Homework: It's Written all over your face. Acts 2: 1-11
