This week we have been learning:

We have been reading and writing about Wind in the Willows in English. We have also been learning about the difference between Halal and Haram in our study of Islam. In maths we have been working on time this week – focusing on telling the time on analogue clocks to the nearest 5 minutes to the hour. We have also been coding in ICT. **Please note: next Friday will be sports day in the afternoon for Orange Class and KS2.**

English: Identify the correct frontal adverb.

Maths: Focus on x8 tables and division facts. Practise telling the time with a digital clock.

Spelling: words spelt with an ou but having the short u sound.

Talk Homework: How do we feel when others make choices for us? How can we use our imagination to adapt to situations where someone else has made the choice?
