This week we have been learning:

In Maths year 1 children, have been learning how to use the greater than, less than and equal to symbols in maths to describe numbers. They picked up the concept of this fairly quickly; as a result we were able to challenge them as to why they think certain symbols are used and if the symbols have been used correctly.

The year 2 children have been looking at partitioning numbers up to 100 and adding two, two – digit numbers, as well as subtracting them. They were stronger at the adding than subtracting, so more practice is needed.

In English we have been writing a set of instructions on how to look after our fictional character, Beegu. The children came up with their own ideas, thinking about what makes them happy and whether this would reflect on whether or not this would make Beegu happy, if it did, they then included it into their instructions.

Phonics/Spelling: look, say, cover, check, write spellings – tea, choke, hole, prune, brute, tube, tune, mean.

Talk Homework: Do we always make the right choice? What do we need to do to always make the right choice?
