



Transition – preparing to start school

- ❖ As a school we have had to adapt rapidly over the past few weeks and can not offer our usual transition routine.
- ❖ We understand that many children will need support to settle and to adjust to their new environment and routines.
- ❖ Our curriculum for September will focus on the children's emotional health and well-being and we will work with you as parents to ensure the children feel safe and happy.
- ❖ Please complete the 'All About Me' booklet so we can get to know your child's interests before they start school. This will help us prepare resources and identify learning opportunities that will best support them.



LEARNING ENVIRONMENT

- ❖ Nursery and Reception Classes have lots of different areas to experience and explore.
- ❖ Many of the activities are practical and can be messy. These types of activities develop the early concepts and skills which are so important to early learning.
- ❖ We provide aprons and encourage the children to use these. However, there are many occasions where the children still manage to get very messy!
- ❖ Our outdoor environment is very popular and it provides many opportunities for children to develop and learn.
- ❖ Except in extreme weather conditions, children have daily access to the outdoor environment.
- ❖ Nursery class go to the school field for Forest School activities and, on these days, children will be asked to come to school in old, warm clothes (tracksuits, jumpers).





ARRIVAL AND COLLECTION

- ❖ The Nursery staff will open the black gate at 9.15 and collect your child from you.
- ❖ We ask that only 1 parent/carer bring your child to school to help maintain social distancing.
- ❖ The gates will be opened at 12.10 for pick-up at 12.15pm. Please wait at the black gate next to the church and your child will be brought to you.
- ❖ If, for any reason, someone different is picking up your child, you must tell us.
- ❖ Children who attend pre-school will be collected by staff and escorted across the playground.
- ❖ Please be patient as we get to know you all. The safety of the children is our overall priority and, initially, it may take a little longer to release them at home time.
- ❖ If your child is unwell and unable to attend please notify the office to let us know.



SNACKS AND DINNERS

Daily Fruit / Vegetable snacks are provided for all Early Years children through a government scheme to help promote Healthy Eating . The children are also offered milk each day.

We ask that each child bring a water bottle to school with their name on. This will be sent home each day to be washed. Children may only have water in this bottle, not juice.

Getting ready for school!

It is nearly time to start school! Here are some things you can practise at home to help you get ready for school.



Self-Care and Independence

- I can wash and dry my hands.
- I can wipe my nose.
- I can put on/fasten my coat and shoes.
- I can use the toilet.
- I am learning to dress/undress – this will help me change for PE.
- I am happy to be away from my parents or carers. I know they will be back soon.



Playing with Others

- I join in games and activities with other people.
- I can share and take turns.

Speaking and Listening

- I can talk about my ideas, needs and feelings.
- I can ask a grown-up for help.
- I can follow simple instructions.



Starting Nursery

Drop-in sessions

7th, 8th, 9th, 10th and 11th September

10am – 11.30

Each child has been allocated a date for a drop-in session. Please only come on the date specified in your letter.

This is a great opportunity to come and meet everyone and to learn more about the learning that takes place in Nursery.

We ask that only one parent attends this session and that you do not bring any siblings with you.

There will be other opportunities to come and visit our Nursery during the year and we hope you understand that presently we need to be mindful of the number of people we are inviting in to school.



Starting Nursery

To help children to settle, and so that the Nursery is not too crowded, the children will start on different dates.

Your child will start on either Monday 14th September or Wednesday 16th September at 9.15am.
