
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Welcome!

Transition – preparing to start school

- ❖ As a school we have had to adapt rapidly over the past few weeks and can not offer our usual transition routine.
- ❖ We understand that many children will need support to settle and to adjust to their new environment and routines.
- ❖ Our curriculum for September will focus on the children's emotional health and well-being and we will work with you as parents to ensure the children feel safe and happy.
- ❖ Please complete the 'All About Me' booklet so we can get to know your child's interests before they start school. This will help us prepare resources and identify learning opportunities that will best support them.
- ❖ For children starting reception class, use the activities sent with your starting letter. These will really support your child in developing independence and help prepare them for school.



Activities to do with your child before reception

We know the beginning of school can feel scary for you and your child. These are also different times and the uncertainty of lockdown means you might be worrying that your child won't be ready for reception. **Don't panic!**
Here are some things you can do with your child at home over the coming weeks to help make



At St. Anne's we support and nurture the holistic development on each child. We work with you to meet your child's development and learning needs in a welcoming, safe, caring, stimulating and fun learning environment.

- ❖ Early Years education is an exciting and important step in children's development and early learning.
- ❖ Research shows that good Early Years Provision lays solid foundations for future learning and achievement.
- ❖ In Early Years education children start to develop self-confidence and self-awareness.
- ❖ They try new things for the first time on their own and feel pride in their achievements.
- ❖ They become independent and begin to take care of their own personal needs.
- ❖ They learn social skills and develop friendships.



LEARNING ENVIRONMENT

- ❖ Nursery and Reception Classes have lots of different areas to experience and explore.
- ❖ Many of the activities are practical and can be messy. These types of activities develop the early concepts and skills which are so important to early learning.
- ❖ We provide aprons and encourage the children to use these. However there are occasions where the children still manage to get messy!
- ❖ Our outdoor environment is very popular and it provided many opportunities for children to develop and learn.
- ❖ Except in extreme weather conditions, children have daily access to the outdoor environment.



ARRIVAL AND COLLECTION

- ❖ Please ensure that your child arrives on time and does not miss out on any learning opportunities.
- ❖ Equally, picking up promptly will ensure that children do not become anxious waiting to be collected.
- ❖ If, for any reason, someone different is picking up your child you must tell us.
- ❖ Please be patient as we get to know you all. The safety of the children is our overall priority and initially it may take a little longer to release them at hometime.
- ❖ We fully understand that young children do succumb to colds and other childhood illnesses at times. However, we also know that good attendance is linked with positive feelings and attitudes towards school, high attainment and good friendships.
- ❖ If your child is unwell and unable to attend please notify the office to let us know.



BOOK BAGS

- ❖ In Reception Class all children will require a book bag to carry Reading Records, Reading Books and Homework between school and home.
- ❖ Please ensure you purchase a flat book bag and not a back pack. The book bags fit the home trays perfectly whereas the back packs do not.
- ❖ Please clearly label the book bag with your child's name.





SNACKS AND DINNERS

Daily Fruit / Vegetable snacks are provided for all Early Years children through a government scheme to help promote Healthy Eating . The children are also offered milk each day.

Reception children are entitled to a school meal through the universal free school meals scheme. This is a well-balanced healthy meal and the children has a number of options to choose from each day.

If you wish to, you can provide a packed lunch for your child instead of a school meal. Please do not include any fizzy drinks or sweets.

Getting ready for school!

It is nearly time to start school! Here are some things you can practise at home to help you get ready for school.



Self-Care and Independence

- I can wash and dry my hands.
- I can wipe my nose.
- I can put on/fasten my coat and shoes.
- I can use the toilet.
- I am learning to dress/undress – this will help me change for PE.
- I am happy to be away from my parents or carers. I know they will be back soon.



Playing with Others

- I join in games and activities with other people.
- I can share and take turns.

Speaking and Listening

- I can talk about my ideas, needs and feelings.
- I can ask a grown-up for help.
- I can follow simple instructions.



Eating and Drinking

- I can use a spoon, knife and fork.
- I can open my lunch box as well as wrappers and packaging.
- I can drink from a water bottle, carton or open cup.


- I can count a small number of items.
