<p>Purchase quality teaching and learning resources to support teachers planning and delivery of lessons.</p> <p>Purchase of quality equipment to enhance provision at playtimes in KS1 and KS2</p>	£1200	Access for all year groups	<p>Resources were purchased in line with the FUNs scheme of work so that lessons could be carried out appropriately. Lessons are well-resourced and these resources can be used again in future years.</p> <p>New equipment was purchased for break and lunchtime provision so that lunchtime clubs and sports leader led activities could continue. Lunch and breaktimes have been far more purposeful and more children have been engaged in physical activity during these times (Key indicator 1). Mini competitions have been organised using this equipment to engage more children in competitive sport throughout the school day (Key indicator 5)</p>

More children have been engaged in competitive sport (KI 5) and accessed a broad range of sports (KI 4)</p> <p>We will continue with this next year.</p>

<p>Oldham Sports Development to support the delivery of high quality PE all year round.</p>	<p>£3949</p>	<p>Y3-Y6 rotated termly</p>	<p>This year Sports development coaches have been utilised to teach dance across the year groups as this was the subject most teachers felt they needed support with. The teachers who have been part of these lessons have been upskilled and coached by the dance teacher and future lessons will now be led by teachers. Next year we will use this resource to ensure all year 6 children are engaging in physical activity and to help us make sure that all children receive one hour of physical activity each week.</p>
<p>Provision of dance as extracurricular activity – provided by Sports Development</p>	<p>£950</p>	<p>Access to all year groups</p>	<p>This has been a huge success and has had a great uptake. Children who would normally not engage in physical activity and after school clubs have been attending this club. This has ensured we provide a broad range of sports (KI 4) and increased children’s engagement in physical activity (KI 1). Unfortunately the children were not able to take part in the end of year performance they were building up to due to the pandemic. This club was originally provided by Sports Development but due to staffing, the organisation were unable to continue with our sessions. The club was taken over by OAFC. To continue with OAFC next year.</p>
<p>Transport to interschool sports events</p>	<p>£750</p>	<p>Access to all year groups</p>	<p>Children have had the opportunity to participate in interschool events. Transport has not been a barrier.</p>
<p>Oldham Sports Development Sports Day</p>	<p>£350</p>	<p>Access to all year groups</p>	<p>This year’s sports day was not completed due to the pandemic.</p>

We have had a large uptake of children participating in the sessions and we have provided a broad range of sporting events in the sessions for our youngest children. (KI 4, 1, 5)
SPLAY for Nursery provided by Oldham Sports Development	£800	Nursery (Spring and Summer)	This again was very successful and the nursery children gained vital early PE skills which they will continue to develop throughout EYFS. Sessions started in January and stopped in March due to the pandemic, they were due to continue until the end of the school year.
Implement 'The Daily Mile' in all classes to promote healthy lifestyles.	NO COST	Whole School	This has been implemented in most classes and has been carried out a breaktimes and led by sports leaders. We still need to work on raising the profile of this activity and build up to our celebration event, which again was not completed due to the pandemic.
To provide boxing sessions for KS2.	£1950	Key Stage 2	This has ensured children are introduced to and provided with a broad range of sports to take part in (KI 4). The club has been a success and we will continue with this next year.
To provide a Teaching Assistant to lead lunchtimes and support sports leaders.	£5000	Whole School	This has been very beneficial to the school. Children are having more productive, more active playtimes and are engaging in more physical activity throughout the school day (KI 1) Competitions have been set up for children to compete in and for sports leaders to lead and this has worked really well. Well-structured playtimes have had a positive impact on behaviour.

To provide staff for extra-curricular activities.	£1280	Whole School	We have had clubs led by staff three nights a week and the football team have been competing fortnightly (KI 5) The clubs have been changed and rotated throughout the year so that the children experience a broad range of activities (KI 4)
To provide additional swimming provision targeted to pupils not able to meet the swimming requirements of the national curriculum.	£850.00		Unfortunately, the additional swimming sessions to target those children in year 6 who are not meeting the national requirements have not been carried out. These were planned for the summer term and the school year was cut short due to the pandemic. We had 95% of year 6 children complete the 25m and reached the national requirement. 95% of the Year 6 cohort use a range of strokes effectively. 100% of the year 6 cohort can perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations.
To provide high quality CPD for staff.	£1155		In September we arranged for a whole school refresher training session in REAL PE. Teachers and TAs were trained to use the new FUNs scheme so that lessons could be confidently planned and the scheme could be followed by all staff.
