English: In English we will be reading 'Journey to Jo'Burg' by Beverley Naidoo. The book focuses on the struggle of two children during Apartheid in South Africa. We will be writing letters and diaries and informative texts. In guided reading we will be focussing on literal questions and understanding the meaning of words in context.

Maths: In Maths we will be focussing on place value and the four operations. We will also be completing some recap lessons to ensure the children have retained their knowledge from the previous year.

Art and Design: In art lessons we will be studying the work of South African sculpture artist Lionel Smit. The children will be learning to use collage to create 3D masks.
