

English: In English we will be reading 'Once' by Morris Gleitzman. This book follows the life of a young Jewish orphan living in Poland during WW2.

We will be writing letters, suspense stories and informative texts. In guided reading we will be reading 'Private Peaceful' by Michael Morpurgo.

Maths: In Maths we will be focussing on addition and subtraction; and statistics.

Science: In Science our topic is 'Evolution and inheritance' Mrs Marshall will be leading our learning in science.

History: We will be learning about World War two. We will discover why the war started, who was involved, how it affected and shaped our country and how and why the war ended.

Art and Design: In art lessons we will be learning to use collage and textiles to help us to create images of The Blitz.

RE: The children will be continuing with our learning on Pentecost and studying the Gospels of Matthew and Luke.

PSHE: The children will be learning about our local community, and what it means to be part of a community.

Computing: The children will be focussing on using technology and learning how to retrieve and organise data. We will also be continuing to think about how we stay safe whilst online.

Music: The children will be studying jazz music. We will be using glockenspiels to recreate some contemporary jazz pieces.

PE: The children will be learning to use static balance; we will also be completing some outdoor and adventurous activities and taking part in virtual, borough wide competitions.
