



## Lime Class Half Termly Newsletter Autumn 2



**English:** In English we will be reading 'The Journal of Iliona- A Young Slave' by Richard Platt. The children will be using different text types to write their own diary entries as if they were a slave. The children will also be completing writing based on a journey, composing a letter and completing descriptive writing based on imagery.

**Maths:** In Maths we will be continuing to focus on multiplication and division. The children will be learning how to use the inverse to check their answers and will be able to estimate securely. The year 4 children will also visit length and perimeter and learn how to convert measurements from cm to m, m to km and be able to solve word problems.

**Science:** In Science we will be learning about Animals including humans. We will be learning different parts of the human body, the digestive system, teeth and food chains.

**History:** In History we will be learning about The Roman Empire and its impact on Britain. We will be visiting Castleshaw as part of this topic where we will be finding out who the Romans were, their place on the historical timeline and the concepts of invaders and settlers. We will also be using some archaeological techniques e.g. dating.

**Why were the Romans so powerful  
and what did we learn from them?**



**DT:** The children will be studying the use of stiff and flexible materials and will be designing and making their very own torches.

**RE:** The children will be learning about Christmas- Exploring the symbolism of light. We will be learning about other festivals of light such as Hanukkah-The Jewish festival of light.

**Homework:** Homework will be set every **Friday** and must be returned the following **Wednesday**. This includes reading books which need to be returned to be changed. Children need to read their books and fill out their reading records. We encourage all parents to listen to their child read and to also sign the reading record to confirm the book has been read. The children will have their homework and reading book in their homework folders on Friday.

**PSHE:** The children will be learning how to communicate effectively and how to empathise with others.

**Computing:** In computing we will be learning about how to stay safe online and other aspects of E-Safety. We will be using technology for communication and presentation skills and Year 4s will be focusing on Data Retrieving and Organising.

**Music:** The children will be learning how to play the glockenspiels.

**PE:** The children will be developing their balancing skills. P.E will take place outdoors to allow for adequate spacing. The unit that will be covered in P.E this half term is all about developing static balance and agility.

Do you get involved in the hope of finding a peaceful solution or do you step back and pretend you didn't see anything?
<b>Week 6</b>	Has anyone seen my Angel? <i>To think about co-operating with each other and supporting each other.</i>	<b>Talk:</b> Think about the tasks you are asked to help with. When you are asked, how do you respond? Are you willing to cooperate with others to perform the task or are you more reluctant to join in? Do you get frustrated if things don't go the way you hoped they would?
