English: In English we will be reading 'The Pied Piper of Hamelin' – a poem by Robert Browning. During this unit we will be writing poems, letters, setting descriptions and non-chronological reports.

Art and Design: The children will be studying cooking and nutrition. We will be making a variety of salads and German foods.
