

Lime Class Half Termly Newsletter Autumn 1



English: In English we will be reading 'The Rotten Romans' and 'A Roman Soldier's Handbook'. We will be linking our learning in history to help us to write Roman diaries, a persuasive speech and a non-chronological report. The children will be learning to write in the first person, use pronouns, choose specific vocabulary and to use fronted adverbials.

<u>Maths:</u> In Maths we will be focussing on Number and Place Value; we will then moving onto addition and subtraction using written methods and mental strategies.

<u>Science:</u> In science we will be studying 'Animals including Humans'. The children will be learning what animals need to stay alive, they will be also be learning about teeth and the digestive system.

<u>History</u>: We will be studying The Roman Empire and its impact on Britain. The children will be learning about emperor Claudius and how he successfully lead an invasion.

Topic:

Why were the Romans so powerful and what did we learn from them?



Art and Design:

In Art we will be exploring pattern this half term. We will be making sensory drawings and learning to make stencils to create our own repeated patterns.

<u>RE:</u> The children will be learning about Harvest and our non-Christian faith unit will be the Jewish festival of Sukkot.

<u>PSHE:</u> The children will be learning about forward through our 'Apple's Friends' scheme of work.

<u>Computing:</u> The children will be learning how the internet can be great; how we can be good friends online; how to stay safe online; and how to create branching databases.

<u>Music:</u> The children will be working on the unit 'Let your spirit fly'. They will be learning to listen to and appraise a range of songs from a variety of artists.

<u>PE</u>: The children will be developing their creativity, balance and counter balance. They will also be developing their orienteering skills out in the playground.

<u>Homework:</u> Homework will be set every <u>Friday</u> and must be return the following <u>Wednesday</u>. This includes reading books which need to be returned to be changed. Children need to read their books and fill out their reading records. We encourage all parents to listen to their child read and to also sign the reading record to confirm the book has been read. The children will have their homework and reading book in their homework folders on Friday.
