

## Lime Class Half Termly Newsletter Spring 1



**English:** In English we will be reading 'The Promise' by Nicola Davies. We will be writing setting descriptions for contrasting images whilst reading this book. We will then move onto 'Emmeline Pankhurst' and study great women that changed the world. The children will be writing biographies for some of the suffragettes and writing reports.

<u>Maths</u>: In Maths we will be continuing with multiplication and division and moving onto fractions.

<u>Science</u>: In Science we will be learning about Living things and their habitats. The children will understand about life processes which are needed in order to stay alive. Excretion, endangered and organisms will be some of the new vocabulary taught.

<u>**History:**</u> In History we will be completing a local study based on our school and its founding fathers. The children will gain an insight into the history behind our school, when it was built, who built it, what was the land used for before our school was built and take a closer look into our local area.

<u>Topic:</u> <u>Who were the founding fathers of our</u> <u>school and how is their vision still alive to-</u> <u>day?</u>



<u>Art and Design</u>: The children will be studying sculpture that tells a story. We will be making 3D objects from our class book 'The Promise' and putting them together as a diorama.

**<u>RE</u>**: The children will be learning about places of worship. We will be studying churches to find out if they are all the same.

<u>**PSHE:</u>** The children will be learning all about friendships and how to be a good friend. This unit allows children to share lots of experiences .</u>

<u>**Computing:</u>** The children will be revising spreadsheets. In E-Safety, they will also be learning about plagiarism and buying items online.</u>

<u>Music</u>: The children will be moving onto the next unit of our music scheme: Three Little Birds. During this the children will learn about the history of songs and will compare different types of music.

**<u>PE</u>**: The children will be completing their health and fitness unit this half term with a focus on co ordination, agility and one– leg static balance.

Homework: Homework will be set every Friday and must be return the following Wednesday. This includes reading books which need to be returned to be changed. Children need to read their books and fill out their reading records. We encourage all parents to listen to their child read and to also sign the reading record to confirm the book has been read. The children will have their homework and reading book in their homework folders on Friday.
